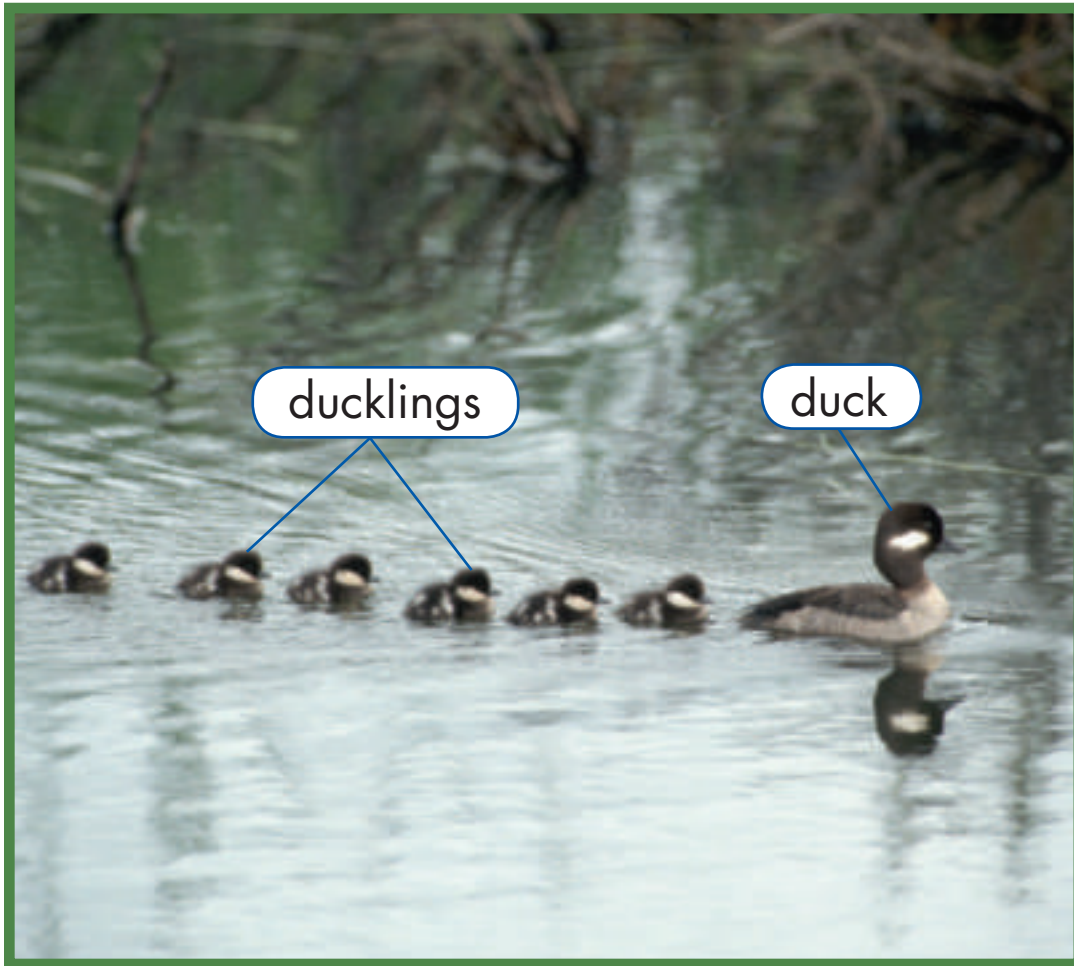



 Baby animals have mothers too.
The mothers take care of the babies.

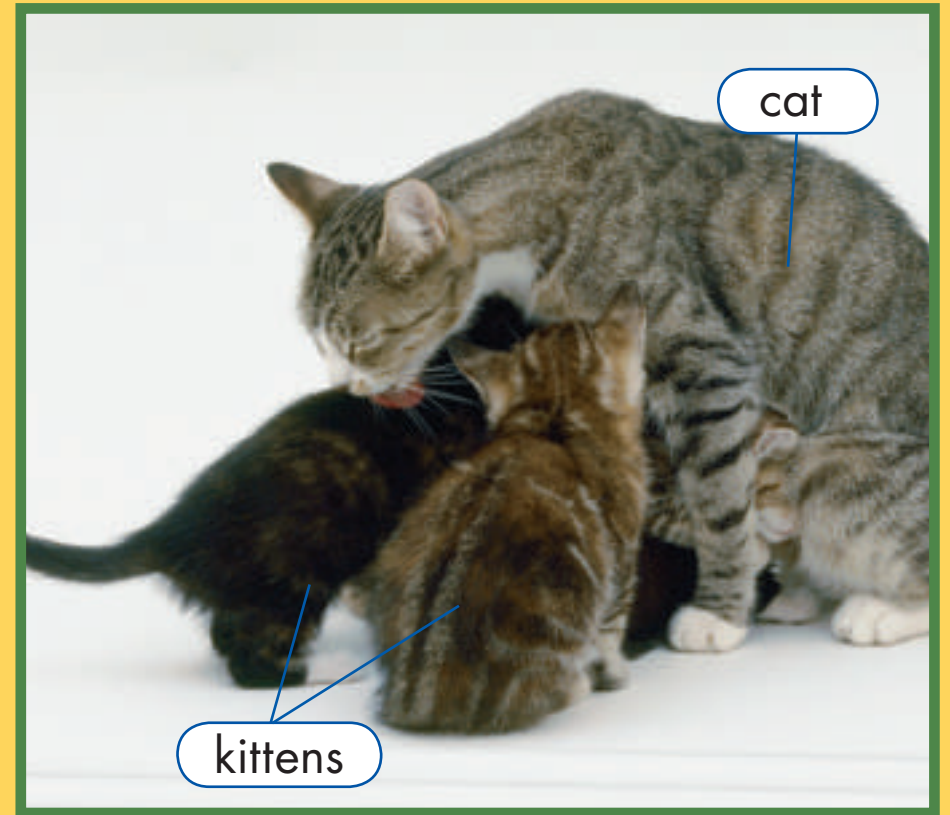



 The mother cow is with her calf.

Her ducklings are swimming behind her.

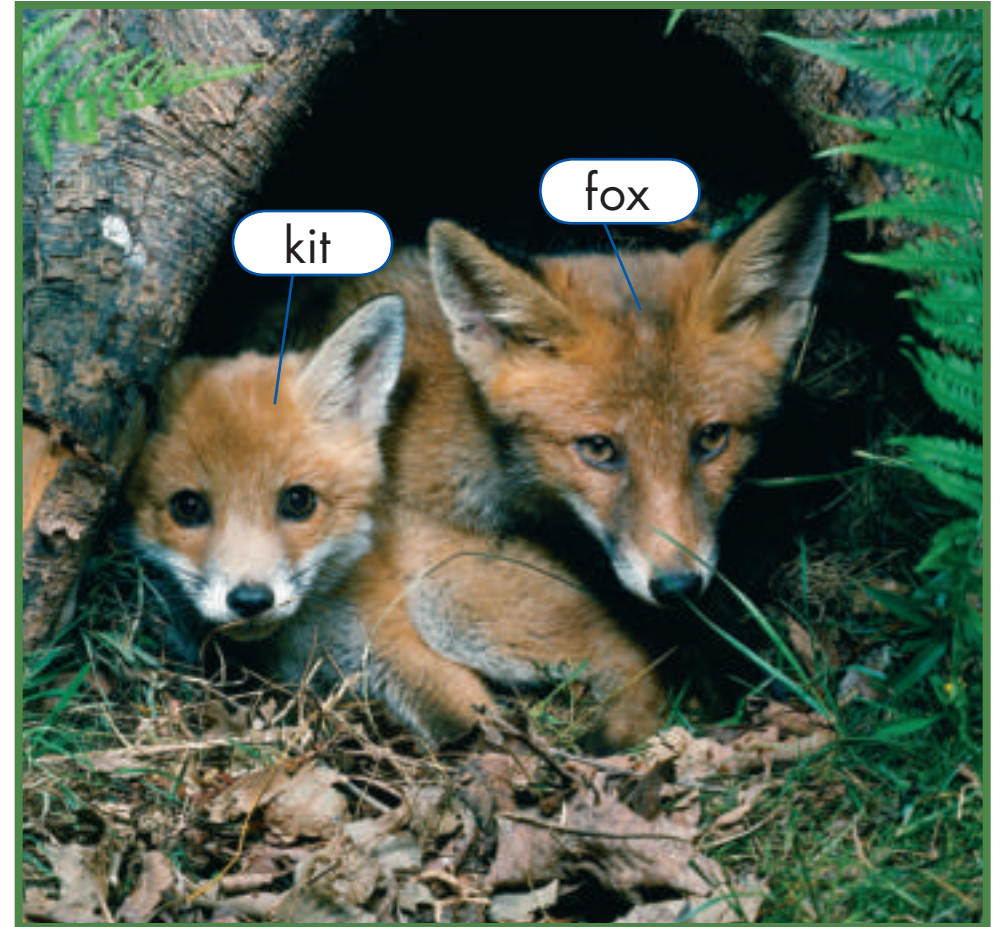


 The mother cat cleans her kitten.
