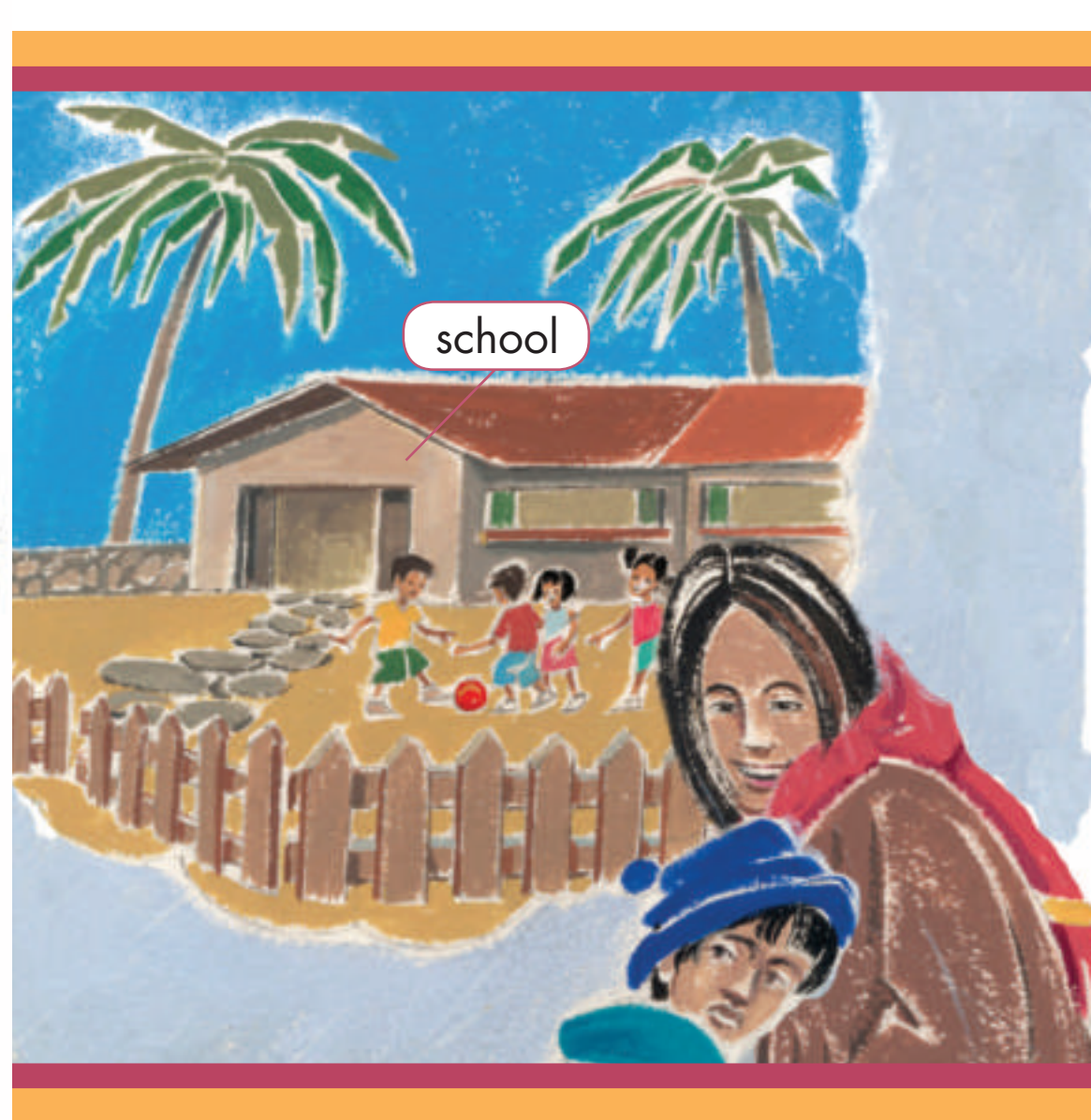

Back home, children spoke Spanish.

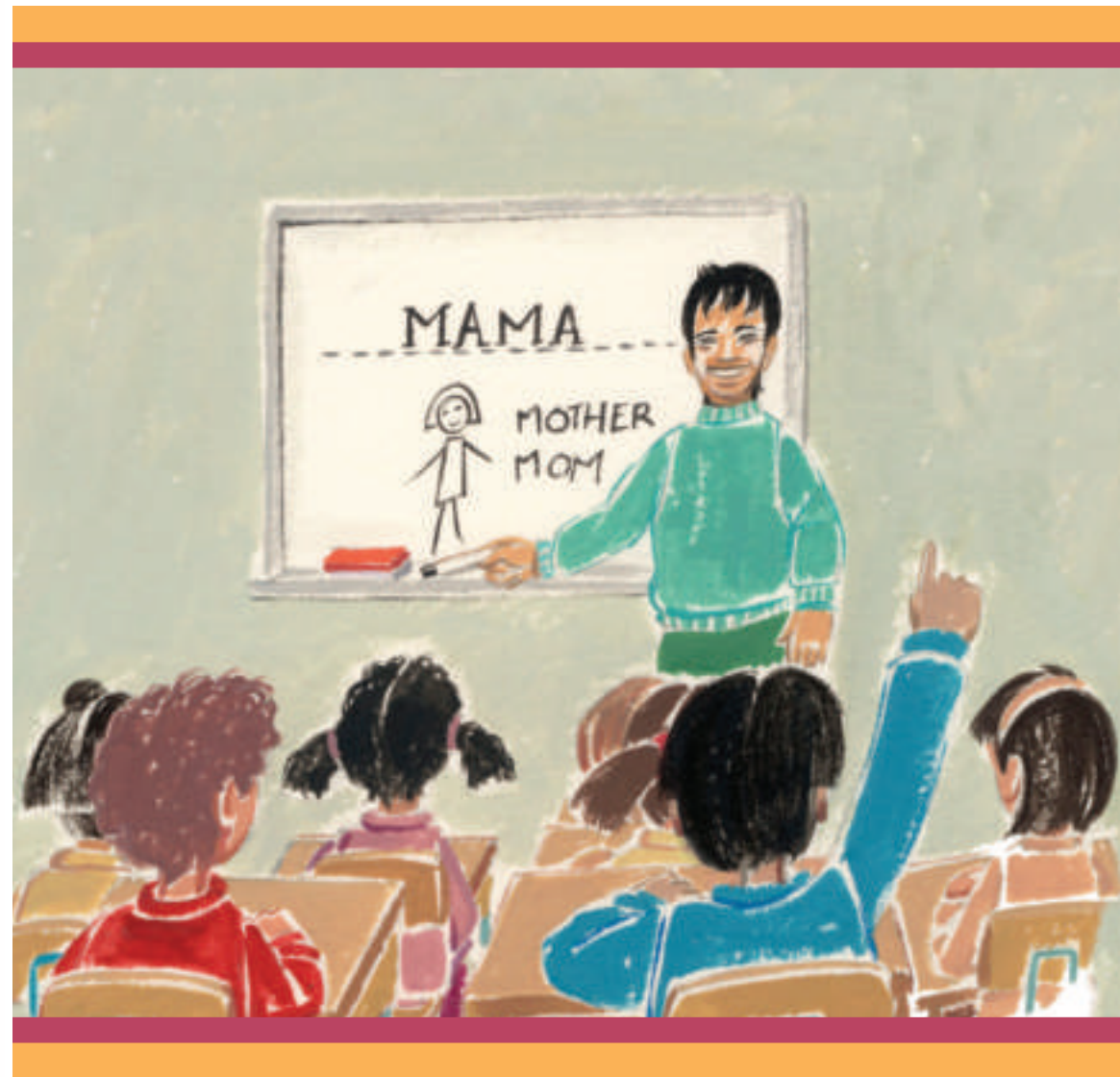
